








Tonight we welcome back **Chris Youett**, with a presentation on the **Midland & Great Northern Joint** – 60 years since closure. The photograph above shows the hub of the system, Melton Constable, with a B12/3 heading for Yarmouth Beach in November 1958, four months before the end, and a glimpse of one of William Marriott's precast concrete signal posts.

Last month's AGM proceeded without sensation. The overall winner of the annual photographic competition, judged by Laurence Waters, was Chris Brennan with 'End of the day' in the black and white category. #### LOCAL RAIL NEWS ROUNDUP

Since the turn of the year, GWR IETs have been running on power electric to Bristol Parkway and partially down the Berks & Hants line, although they are prevented from working Newbury-Bedwyn services until a problem with the onboard door monitoring video system is resolved. However, local services as far as Newbury are worked by Class 387s (photo). EMUs of this class are stabled



Swindon Cocklebury sidings and worked empty daily to Didcot to take up service; the new stabling sidings at Maidenhead have been given over to Crossrail. Talks are now proceeding on the takeover of Paddington–Reading locals by Transport *for* London from this December, as would have been the case if the Elizabeth Line were to have opened at this time. And finally... news of an Oxfordshire rail closure: Adrian Shooter has announced that his private Beeches Light Railway will be closing after 15 years in May this year at his Steeple Aston home to move to a new location.
