


The winners of our annual photographic competition announced last month were:


Brian Higgins: Steam and overall winner for No. 4 at Abergynolwyn

### **DISPERSALS**

Next month, Great Western's fleet of class 769 trimodal units, some of which have been stored at Oxford, is intended for return to lessee Porterbrook without turning a wheel in scheduled passenger service.

For several years a group known as the Coulsdon Old Vehicle & Engineering Society built a private collection of rolling stock from Network SouthEast at Finmere station (the only Oxfordshire Great Central station). Forced from the site by HS2 work, it moved in 2019 to a shed at Graven Hill on the MoD site at Bicester. Although compensation was due from HS2 it was apparently not available in time to secure the site at Bicester and the collection is now being dispersed. Channel Tunnel rescue locomotive 73 130 has moved to the somewhat unlikely location of the Llanelli & Mynydd Mawr Railway, and agreement has been reached for a 2-car Oxted line diesel-electric multiple unit to go to the Bluebell Railway. The collection also included several ex-Oxford buses.

GWR has purchased assets of Vivarail in order to continue trials with battery trains. D1023 *Western Fusilier* has moved from York to Didcot on a 5-year loan.



### **SCOTSMAN ANNIVERSARIES**

As you will know, *Flying Scotsman* celebrates its centenary this year. The third Pacific ordered by the Great Northern Railway, she was turned out of the newly-formed London & North Eastern Railway's Doncaster works on 7 February 1923 and shown off at Marylebone on 22 February. At that time she was known as class A1 no. 1472 and shedded at Doncaster. During her 1950–53 sojourn on the Great Central she would have been seen at Finmere (*see above*) but 18 May is the 60th anniversary of her first recorded appearance at Oxford, on a 1963 special from Doncaster to Basingstoke

and Southampton. Her only tour so far scheduled to pass near us this year is a Paddington–Cardiff run on Wednesday 7 June. *The photograph shows her blinkered at Oxford in 2017*.
