
Tonight, **Tony Stead** is giving a presentation on the **Cholsey & Wallingford Railway**.

NUNEHAM VIADUCT OPEN

Network Rail completed work on Nuneham Viaduct a day ahead of schedule, on Friday.



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We can now give a bit more detail of the Nuneham Viaduct reconstruction process: Firstly, temporary piles were driven into the river (using a piling rig on a floating platform) from which the bridge deck could be supported on jacks – this was done early in May. Part of the southern embankment was then removed to provide access for another piling rig – borrowed from Old Oak Common station works – to drive permanent piles to support the replacement abutment. The embankment was then reinstated and the deck jacked back down into position.

NEW TIMETABLES

The summer timetables introduced on 21–22 May have brought in some significant changes. The Elizabeth Line is ramped up to full capacity, with consequent adjustments to Reading–Paddington services. On resumption, Oxford–Paddington fast trains are adding calls at Didcot Parkway but off-peak services from the Cotswold Line to Paddington will cease to call at Slough. Chiltern Railways have also announced a retiming of practically all their trains, with Oxford getting "much more consistent departure times to and from London throughout the day", and Banbury a regular half-hourly service to Marylebone via Bicester North; however Chiltern is ceasing to serve Kidderminster.

OTHER LOCAL RAIL NEWS

18-19 May were unfortunate days on Oxfordshire's railways, with persons killed on the track at Kidlington and at Didcot station. In an unrelated incident near Kidlington on 18 May, a car was hit by a train on Sandy Lane level crossing, fortunately without serious injuries; the crossing is intended to be replaced by a bridge in conjunction with Oxford station reconstruction. ** Reading Green Park station opened officially on 27 May (with a ceremony two days earlier), served by GWR's Basingstoke services. ** Oxfordshire County Council has published a feasability study for reinstating a Carterton-Witney-Eynsham-Oxford rail connection. It is described as "workable" and "justified" but would cost up to £900M. ** The Transport Secretary has confirmed the agreed route for the final section of East West Rail, the southern approach to Cambridge, and work on Cambridge South station has started. ** This month's Railway Modeller has a feature marking completion (actually last September) of Pendon Museum's Midland & South Western Junction line within its Vale of White Horse scene – a good reason to revisit. ** A second phase of restoration for the Rewley Road swing bridge and its environs is starting. ** Refurbishment of the 'Brunel Engine Shed' – actually the Wycombe Railway trainshed - at High Wycombe being now complete, Buckinghamshire New University is now expected to lease it as a café and display space.
