
Badminton station on the GWR's Bristol & South Wales Direct line.

### **RAIL NEWS UPDATES**

Rolling stock leasing company Porterbrook agreed a deal in March to purchase the Long Marston Rail Innovation Centre (which it has been managing since 2021) and has now announced that it intends to instal overhead wire electrification and cab signalling on the test track there by the end of next year.

GB Railfreight have experimentally launched a new scheduled intermodal service from Solent Rail Terminal at Southampton to Hams Hall in the west midlands; this is due through Oxford at 10:12 when it runs, class 66-hauled with a new rake of wagons delivered for the service.

68 010 *Oxford Flyer*, working Chiltern's 13.42 Birmingham Moor Street to Marylebone, disgraced itself on Sunday 5 May when it failed at Fenny Compton; it took five hours to recover it.

The new subway and ramp access to Didcot Railway Centre is now functional.

The Model T Ford-based rail inspection car from Adrian Shooter's Beeches Light Railway has rematerialised in the new museum in Aberystwyth locomotive shed on the Vale of Rheidol Railway.
