




A HUNDRED AND FIFTY YEARS ON

On 2 October, a plaque was unveiled at Bicester Village station to mark the 150th anniversary of the coming of the railway to the town. The line from Bletchley through to Islip opened on 1 October 1850. The L&NWR extended services to a temporary Oxford station in Banbury Road (approximately the site of today's Parkway) on 2 December, although special trains ran to here on 22 November to carry clergy to a meeting called by the Bishop of Oxford to protest against "Papal Aggression" (an English Catholic hierarchy had just been reinstated, a touchy matter in Victorian Oxford). Oxford Rewley Road didn't open until the following year. Bicester North, is of course, a relative youngster, and its centenary was marked by a plaque in 2010.

FIFTY YEARS ON

News from 1975, the year of the ORS's establishment: **October 4** London Transport last operated over the Northern City line from Old Street to Drayton Park prior to its takeover by BR as part of the Great Northern electrification project. **October 5** Sealink MV *Hibernia* completed her last crossing on the Holyhead–Dún Laoghaire service, the last conventional mailboat on the route. **October 6** The Scottish Region reinstated passenger services over the 20-mile Perth–Ladybank–Edinburgh route (closed in 1955). **October 27** BR's TOPS installation was officially completed. **October 31** Closure of the dairy at Hemyock brought an end to traffic on the Culm Valley branch in Devon.
